Princess Pauahi left her estate for the education of native Hawaiian children, decreeing that all her teachers and trustess be Protestants, Christians. Pauahi`s Will also states that the children be given instructions in morals by word and deed so that the children might become good and industrious men and women. She was the great-granddaughter and last direct heir of King Kamehameha I.
